PROCLAMATION

I. EDMUND G. BROWN JR., Governor of the State of California, having found conditions of extreme peril no longer exist which threaten the safety of persons and property, and, further finding local authorities are now able to cope with the situation, therefore, proclaim the State of Emergency previously proclaimed on the following dates and in the following jurisdictions no longer exists, effective immediately.

- February 19, 1980 County of Riverside (rains, flooding and mudslides). This county was not previously terminated due to continuing problems at Lake Elsinore.
- September 30, 1980 County of San Joaquin (Jones Tract levee break).
- November 18, 1980 Counties of Los Angeles, Orange and Riverside (Major fires).
- November 25, 1980 County of San Bernardino (Major fires).
- June 24, 1981 County of Napa (Major brush fire).
- January 5, 1982 Counties of Contra Costa, Humboldt, Marin, San Mateo, Santa Cruz, and Sonoma (Heavy winds, rains, flooding and mudslides).
- January 9, 1982 Counties of Alameda, Santa Clara, Solano and San Joaquin (Heavy winds, rains, flooding and mudslides).
- April 21, 1982 County of Orange (Strong winds and raging fire).
