EXECUTIVE ORDER B 78 - 81

WHEREAS, there is a need to consolidate the State of California's state government energy conservation and renewable resources activities for state facilities in a formal and permanent body;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Edmund G. Brown Jr., Governor of the State of California, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by the Constitution and statutes of the State of California, do hereby issue this order to become effective immediately:

1. There is established the State Government Energy Task Force consisting of representatives of the following state agencies:

- California Conservation Corps
- Department of Corrections
- Department of Developmental Services
- Office of Emergency Services
- Department of Employment Development
- Division of Fairs and Expositions
- Department of Finance
- Department of Fish and Game
- Department of Food and Agriculture
- Department of Forestry
- Department of General Services
- Department of Health Services
- Department of Housing
and Community Development
- Department of Highway Patrol
- Department of Mental Health
- Military Department
- Department of Motor Vehicles
- Department of Parks and Recreation
- Office of Planning and Research
- Office of Appropriate Technology
- Department of Transportation
- Department of Water Resources
- Department of the Youth Authority
- California Energy Commission

2. The following agencies are encouraged to participate in the Task Force and this Order to the greatest extent feasible:

- Board of Governors, Community Colleges
- Public Utilities Commission
- Regents of the University of California
- State Air Resources Board
- Trustees of the California State
University and Colleges

3. The Director of the Department of General Services shall chair the Task Force and will have primary responsibility for developing overall plans for energy conservation and renewable resources by state agencies and assuring timely implementation of such programs.

4. The State Government Energy Task Force shall

- .. direct, coordinate and assist energy conservation and renewable resources programs and the development of alternative energy technologies in state agencies and operations;
- .. develop sufficient generating capacity at state facilities equal to the state government's own electricity needs by 1990;
- .. provide private industry and local governments with information on the state government energy program of the State of California.

5. Agencies participating in the State Government Energy Task Force shall:

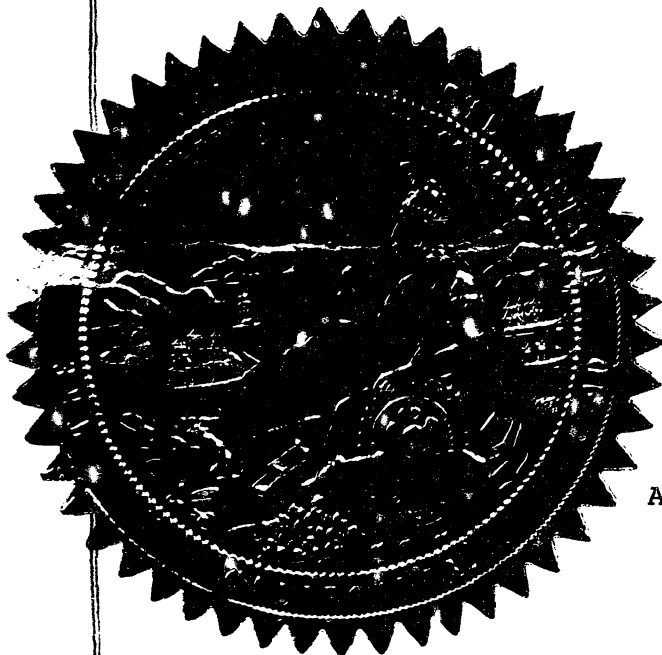
- .. designate energy managers for all state facilities;
- .. monitor their monthly energy use and report thereon quarterly to the Task Force;
- .. participate in energy conservation and production programs as directed by the Task Force;
- .. develop energy conservation plans to achieve a twenty percent (20%) reduction in their energy needs by fiscal year 1983-84;
- .. develop plans for maximum implementation by 1985 of alternative energy technologies such as cogeneration, small hydroelectric, solar thermal, solar photovoltaic, geothermal, wind and biomass.

6. The Office of Appropriate Technology shall coordinate in cooperation and consultation with the California Energy Commission technical advice on energy policy and technology to the Task Force and participating agencies.
