PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, each year more tourists visit California than any other state in the nation; and

WHEREAS, more than 29 million domestic and international travellers are attracted here annually to California's scenic mountains, wild rivers, exciting cities, verdant countryside, and sun-warmed deserts; and

WHEREAS, California residents have always welcomed those who have come from out-of-state to share with them the natural and man-made attractions which have made this state unique; and

WHEREAS, travel and tourism in California encompass an infinite variety of recreational and leisure activities which can be enjoyed by all persons regardless of age, sex, culture, physical handicap or income level; and

WHEREAS, travel and tourism has greatly contributed to the strength and vitality of California's economy, producing annual receipts of more than \$21 billion and supporting approximately 487,000 jobs; and

WHEREAS, this administration supports the efforts of the private and public sectors to further develop this industry so vital to our State's well-being;

NOW, THEREFORE I, Edmund G. Brown Jr., Governor of the State of California, do hereby proclaim the month of May 1982 as "California Travel and Tourism" month as an expression of the interest of all Californians in promoting the travel and tourism industry in our state.
