PROCLAMATION  
OF A  
STATE OF EMERGENCY

I, EDMUND G. BROWN JR., Governor of the State of California, having found that conditions of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property exists within the Counties of Monterey and Riverside, State of California, based on the threat of floods and mudslides resulting from denuded watershed by the major fires beginning on July 28, 1977, which, by reason of their magnitude, are beyond the control of the services, personnel, equipment and facilities of said counties, and having been requested by the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors of the Counties of Monterey and Riverside to proclaim a State of Emergency in said counties, I therefore proclaim the existence of a State of Emergency in the Counties of Monterey and Riverside; and

I DIRECT that as soon hereafter as possible this proclamation be filed in the Office of the Secretary of State and that widespread publicity and notice be given to this proclamation.

I herewith determine that a State of Emergency, as set forth in the Declaration of Emergency signed by the Director of Water Resources on August 31, 1977, does exist, and that funds for the work and remedial measures set forth therein are available. The Department of Finance is directed to allocate to the Department of Water Resources such amount as will be required to meet the emergency.
