EXECUTIVE ORDER B-49-78

WHEREAS, Chapter 722 of the Statutes of 1978 (AB 1068, Fazio) establishes procedures for administrative adjudication of minor traffic infractions on a pilot project basis; and

WHEREAS, the aforementioned legislation creates the Traffic Adjudication Board to conduct and oversee said pilot program; and

WHEREAS, the pilot program must have sufficient time for implementation so that the cost savings and traffic safety benefits of administrative adjudication may be fully realized;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Edmund G. Brown Jr., Governor of the State of California, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by the Constitution and statutes of the State of California, do hereby issue this order to become effective immediately:

1. The Traffic Adjudication Board shall, for organizational purposes, be located within the Business and Transportation Agency.
2. Until such time as the Board is formally appointed, implementation of the pilot program shall be commenced and administered by the Secretary of the Business and Transportation Agency, who shall also take all steps necessary to obtain federal funding for the project.

3. The Secretary of the Business and Transportation Agency is hereby authorized to hire sufficient staff from federal funds, or Vehicle Code fines and forfeitures, to begin implementation of the pilot program subject to approval by the Department of Finance.
