EXECUTIVE ORDER B-24-76

WHEREAS, special funds are available through federal and local agencies and private non-profit organizations to provide manpower services to residents of the State of California; and

WHEREAS, the Employment Development Department has been mandated by the California Legislature and the U. S. Department of Labor to provide manpower services to the people of California; and

WHEREAS, civil service hiring procedures inhibit the California Employment Development Department from administering special manpower projects; and

WHEREAS, the use of "exempt" appointments would eliminate the problems presented by civil service hiring procedures;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Edmund G. Brown Jr., Governor of the State of California, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by the Constitution and statutes of the State of California, do hereby issue this order to become effective immediately:

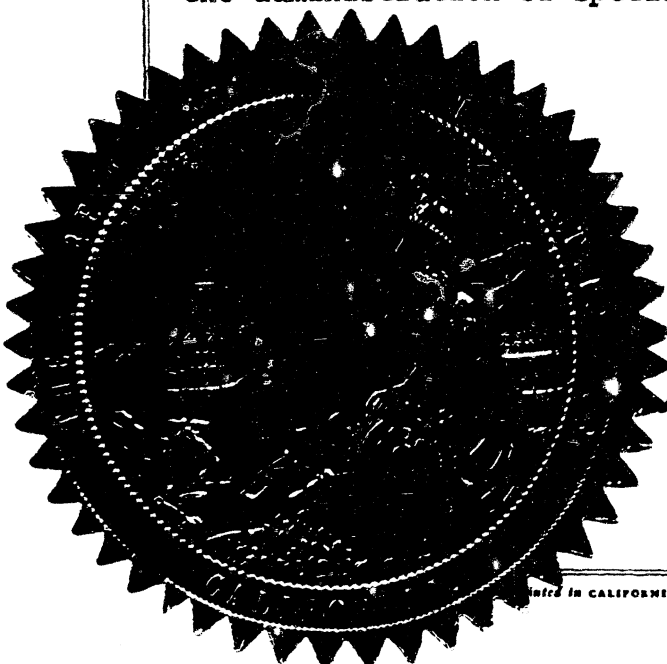
I

Individuals hired under special manpower services contracts requiring personal characteristics atypical of regular civil service employees may be appointed by the Governor of California;

II

The Director of the Employment Development Department is authorized to exercise the power to execute any necessary appointment documentation and the administration of the oath of office for the purpose, and only to the extent necessary for the administration of special manpower projects.
