WHEREAS, in addition to enriching lives, institutions of higher learning train our young people for the economic challenges which lie ahead; and

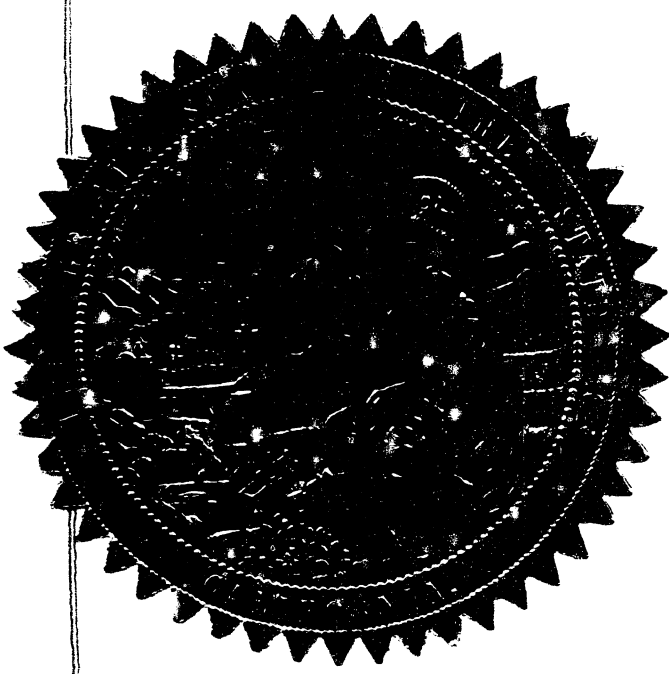
WHEREAS, those challenges involve such vital, expanding fields as computers and robotics where foreign competition is stiff; and
