PROCLAMATION
OF A
STATE OF EMERGENCY

I, EDMUND G. BROWN JR., Governor of the State of California, having found that conditions of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property exists within the County of Humboldt, State of California, beginning on December 20, 1977, as a result of high winds, storms, and other conditions which, by reason of their magnitude, are beyond the control of the services, personnel, equipment and facilities of said County, and having been requested by the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Humboldt to proclaim a State of Emergency in said County, I therefore proclaim the existence of a State of Emergency in the County of Humboldt; and

I DIRECT that as soon hereafter as possible this proclamation be filed in the Office of the Secretary of State and that widespread publicity and notice be given to this proclamation.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of California to be affixed.
