WHEREAS, on the 12th day of February, 1963, a State of Disaster was proclaimed to exist in the City of Redondo Beach as a result of abnormally high tides and heavy surf of the Pacific Ocean, which started on or about February 10, 1963, causing extensive damage to public and private property and threatening further danger to the lives, health and well-being of persons, the safety of public and private property, and the maintenance of essential services; and

WHEREAS, the conditions warranting and necessitating the proclamation of such State of Disaster are now deemed not to be beyond the control of the normal protective services, personnel, equipment and facilities of said City of Redondo Beach;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, EDMUND G. BROWN, Governor of the State of California, by virtue of the powers and authority vested in me by the Constitution and laws of this State, do hereby proclaim the termination of said State of Disaster; and

I DIRECT that this proclamation shall take effect immediately and shall, as soon hereafter as possible, be filed in the Office of the Secretary of State of the State of California.




