PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, an extraordinary occasion has arisen and now exists requiring that the Legislature of the State of California be convened in extraordinary session; now, therefore,

I, EDMUND G. BROWN, Governor of the State of California, by virtue of the power and authority in me vested by Section 9 of Article V of the Constitution of the State of California, do hereby convene the Legislature of the State of California to meet in extraordinary session at Sacramento, California, on the tenth day of February, 1966, at 11:00 a.m. of said day for the following purpose and to legislate upon the following subjects:

Item No. 1. To consider and act upon legislation relative to accounting procedures used by the state with respect to revenue derived pursuant to the Bank and Corporation Tax Law.

Item No. 2. To consider and act upon legislation relative to procedures and practices in assessing property for purposes of taxation.

Item No. 3. To consider and act upon legislation relative to financing capital outlay for construction or improvement of public schools.

Item No. 4. To consider and act upon legislation relative to the employment of additional teachers at public schools within areas of acute poverty.

Item No. 5. To consider and act upon legislation relative to consolidation of community-level services and facilities of governmental agencies and officers.

Item No. 6. To consider and act upon legislation relative to incendiary devices and activities, and interference with police and firefighting.

Item No. 7. To consider and act upon legislation relative to enabling courts to function properly in event of large, sudden increase of criminal cases.

Item No. 8. To consider and act upon legislation relative to the San Francisco Bay Area Rapid Transit District and the Southern California Rapid Transit District.

Item No. 9. To consider and act upon legislation relative to augmentation of the emergency funds.

Item No. 10. To consider and act upon legislation relative to motor vehicle pollution control.

Item No. 11. To consider and act upon legislation relative to:

- a. The regulation and control of outdoor advertising along or adjacent to highways.
- b. The screening and removal of junkyards, automotive graveyards and scrap-processing plants along or adjacent to highways.
- c. The acquisition and preservation of scenic areas along or adjacent to highways.

Item No. 12. To consider and act upon legislation relative to water pollution and water quality protection in the Lake Tahoe Basin.

Item No. 13. To consider and act upon legislation relative to the establishment of a system for gathering, storing, handling, and reporting information by the state and other government organizations.

Item No. 14. To consider and act upon legislation relative to implying consent of persons arrested for driving while intoxicated to chemical tests.

Item No. 15. To consider and act upon legislation relative to making an appropriation for funding the non-reimbursable joint costs and specific land costs for recreation and fish and wildlife enhancement associated with state water projects.

Item No. 16. To consider and act upon legislation relative to ratification of the California-Nevada Interstate Compact.

Item No. 17. To consider and act upon legislation relative to ratification of the Interstate Compact for Education.

Item No. 18. To consider and act upon legislation relative to:

- a. A program of guaranteed loans for students at institutions of higher education.
- b. Designating the State Scholarship Commission as the state agency to carry out the purposes and provisions of Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965 (P.L. 89-329).

- c. Designating the Coordinating Council for Higher Education as the state educational agency to carry out the purposes and provisions of Title I and Title VI of the Higher Education Act of 1965 (P.L. 89-329), and Section 802 of the Housing Act of 1964.

Item No. 19. To consider and act upon legislation relative to:

- a. Validating the organization, boundaries, governing officers or boards, acts, proceedings and bonds of public bodies.
- b. Validating the late filing of documents under Chapter 8 (commencing with Section 54900) of Part 1 of Division 2 of Title 5 of the Government Code.

Item No. 20. To consider and act upon legislation relative to state cooperation with the federal government in connection with the Auburn-Folsom South Unit, American River Division, Central Valley Project.

Item No. 21. To consider and act upon legislation relative to tax relief for the elderly.

Item No. 22. To consider and act upon legislation relative to increasing the compensation of clerical employees of the state.
