PROCLAMATION

Preventing Tokay Grape Crop Loss

WHEREAS, An unseasonal and heavy rainfall has occurred in many parts of California over the past three days, September 17 through September 19; and

WHEREAS, In certain Tokay grape producing sections of Northern California this unseasonal rain endangers the marketability of the important Tokay grape crop; and

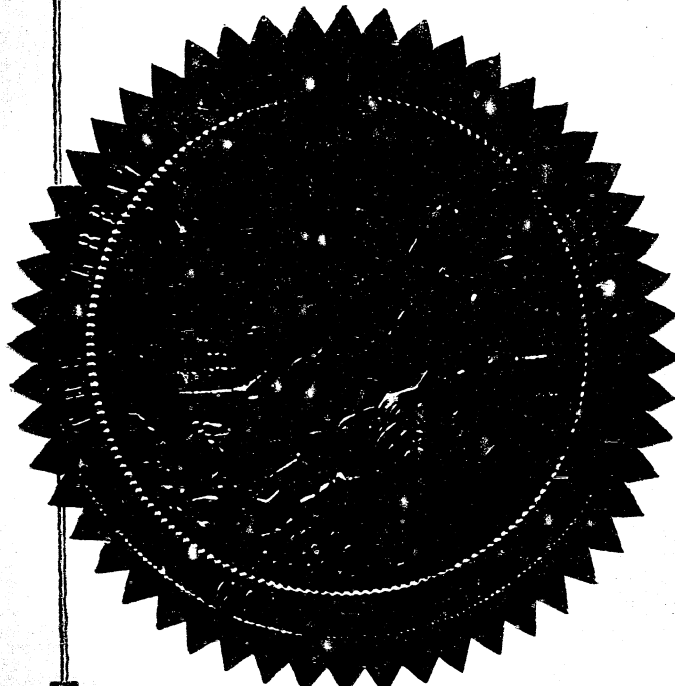
WHEREAS, This emergency requires unusual action to reduce the loss which will be encountered by many producers, which will total several millions of dollars unless prompt protective action is taken;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Edmund G. Brown, Governor of California, do proclaim that a state of emergency exists in said Tokay grape producing areas of Northern California warranting the use of every device, service and equipment as an aid to prevent deterioration of the crop about to be, or in the process of being, harvested, and do direct that the Director of the California Disaster Office and other agencies of the State of California take prompt and effective action to render all possible aid to growers in view of the threat which the recent rainfall poses to the important Tokay grape crop of California.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of California to be affixed this 19th day of September, 1959.
