WHEREAS, Section 1535.1 of the Military and Veterans Code provides:

"The Governor may make, amend, and rescind the necessary orders, rules, and regulations to carry out the provisions of this chapter with due consideration of the plans of the Federal Government. . . . Any orders, rules and regulations or amendments or rescissions thereof, made in the absence of a state of extreme emergency shall be in writing, shall be exempt from the provisions of the Administrative Procedure Act . . ., but shall be subject to the approval of the Disaster Council, and shall take effect immediately upon such approval.";

NOW, THEREFORE, I, EDMUND G. BROWN, Governor of the State of California, by virtue of the powers and authority vested in me by the Constitution and laws of this State and in accordance with the provisions of Section 1535.1 of the Military and Veterans Code, do hereby rescind Orders No. 1 through 13, inclusive, which were issued on January 27, 1958, to take effect in a state of extreme emergency existing pursuant to Section 1505.5 of the Military and Veterans Code, such rescission to be effective immediately.

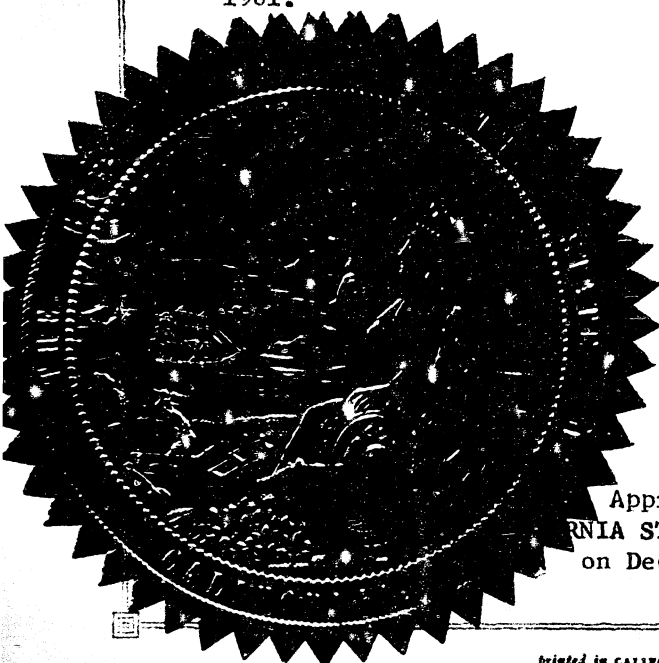
