PROCLAMATION

EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, an abnormally heavy and continuous rainfall has occurred in recent days throughout the northern portion of the State of California which has caused serious damage both to private and public property, as a consequence of which the cities and counties of the state have suffered serious damage to their road systems and have sustained loss of drainage structures, roadbeds, and road surfaces on the Federal-aid secondary system, and, in addition thereto, the state highway system, which includes the Federal-aid interstate and primary systems and portions of the Federal-aid secondary system, has suffered serious damage and has sustained loss of bridges, drainage structures, roadbeds and road surfaces, all of which constitutes an emergency affecting the entire State of California; and

WHEREAS, disastrous damage has been sustained by the public highways of California, resulting in the necessity for immediate repair or reconstruction of highways and bridges on the interstate, primary and secondary Federal-aid highway systems and other bridges and highways in the state highway systems; and

WHEREAS, such conditions constitute an emergency as contemplated by the terms of Section 125 of Title 23 U.S. Code, as amended by Section 107 of the Federal-aid Highway Act of 1959, and by Section 188.1 of the Streets and Highways Code;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Edmund G. Brown, Governor of the State of California, do hereby proclaim that an emergency exists throughout the northern portion of the State of California from the southerly boundaries of the Counties of Sonoma, Napa, Yolo, Sutter, Placer, El Dorado, and Alpine to the Oregon state line, as a result of the storm and flood conditions and consequent damage to and loss of bridges and highways on the interstate, primary and secondary highway systems and other bridges and highways in the state highway system; that the immediate repair and reconstruction of such damaged and destroyed highways and bridges is vital to the security, well-being and health of the citizens of the State of California; and that the Secretary of Commerce of the United States is hereby requested to concur in the declaration of this emergency.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of California to be affixed this 23rd day of December, 1964.
