PROCLAMATION
DECLARING THE TERMINATION
of the
STATE OF DISASTER

WHEREAS, on the 15th day of September, 1964, a State of Disaster was proclaimed to exist in the County of Marin as a result of tidal waves caused by an earthquake between March 28, 1964, and March 30, 1964, creating imminent danger to the safety of persons and property and to the maintenance of essential services therein; and

WHEREAS, the conditions warranting and necessitating the proclamation of such State of Disaster are now deemed not to be beyond the control of the normal protective services, personnel, equipment and facilities of the public agencies and political subdivisions of that county;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, EDMUND G. BROWN, Governor of the State of California, by virtue of the powers and authority vested in me by the Constitution and laws of this State, do hereby proclaim the termination of said State of Disaster; and

I DIRECT that this proclamation shall take effect immediately and shall, as soon hereafter as possible, be filed in the Office of the Secretary of State of the State of California.

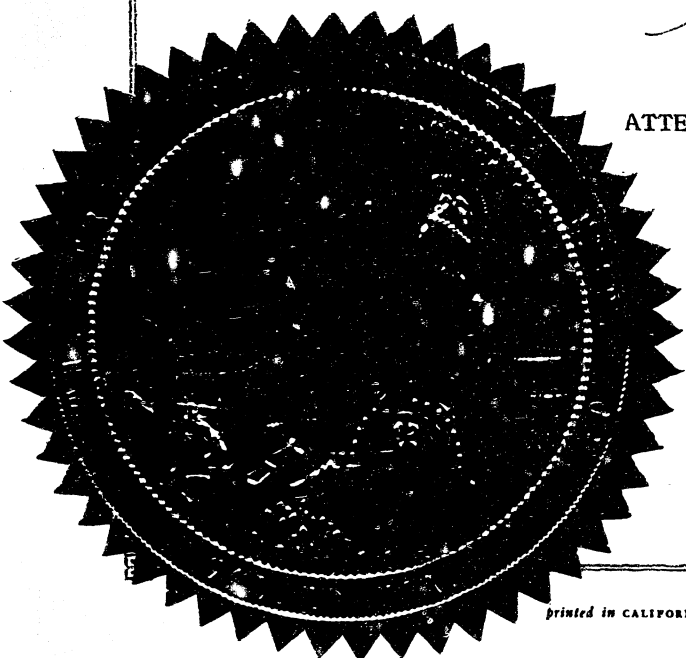
