PROCLAMATION

OF A

STATE OF DISASTER

WHEREAS, the laws of the State of California empower the Governor to proclaim a State of Disaster in an area or region of this State affected or likely to be affected by certain conditions of extreme peril to persons and property within the State, which proclamation shall be in writing and shall take effect immediately upon its issuance; and

WHEREAS, it is further provided by law that "every person who at 12 o'clock meridian of the first Monday in March of 1964 was the owner or, or had in his possession, or under his control, any taxable property which was thereafter damaged or destroyed by a tidal wave caused by an earthquake between March 28, 1964 and March 30, 1964, and the property was located in an area which was subsequently proclaimed by the Governor to be in a state of disaster, may, on or before September 30, 1964, make application for reassessment of such property" and that the "assessor shall, within 10 days of the receipt of a timely application, assess the property, or reassess it if it has already been assessed, according to the condition and value immediately after the damage or destruction"; and

WHEREAS, I, as Governor of the State of California, have found, and do hereby find:

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1. That conditions of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property within this State did arise and exist in the County of Marin, State of California, as a result of tidal waves caused by an earthquake between March 28, 1964 and March 30, 1964; and
2. That the Governor has been requested to proclaim a State of Disaster therein by the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Marin; and
3. That local authority in directly affected areas was inadequate to cope with the aforesaid conditions of extreme peril by reason of their magnitude; and
4. That the aforesaid conditions of extreme peril warrant and necessitate the proclamation of the existence of a State of Disaster.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, EDMUND G. BROWN, Governor of the State of California, by virtue of the powers and authority vested in me by the Constitution and laws of this State, do hereby proclaim the existence of a State of Disaster in the County of Marin, State of California; and

I DIRECT that this proclamation shall take effect immediately, and that as soon hereafter as possible this proclamation be filed in the office of the Secretary of State of the State of California; and that widespread publicity and notice be given to this proclamation.

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IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused
the Great Seal of the State of California to be affixed.
