EXECUTIVE ORDER 66-10

State of California - Summer Neighborhood Youth Corps Project

By virtue of the authority vested in me as Governor of the State of California, I hereby proclaim the following statement regarding the Neighborhood Youth Corps projects to be the official policy of the Executive Department of the State of California.

ARTICLE I

STATEMENT OF INTRODUCTION

The Federal Office of Economic Opportunity and the United States Department of Labor, which administer the Neighborhood Youth Corps (NYC), have allocated to each California county the funds available for summer youth training programs to begin in June, 1966. Several counties do not have summer NYC projects approved, proposed or planned. The reason for the lack of summer projects in many counties is that the allocation to a particular county is not large enough to justify the time and expense involved in developing such a project; in other counties there are no organizations with sufficient resources to develop the projects.

The summer NYC projects provide valuable opportunities for experience, training and education which must not be lost for our state. California's future is founded upon the development and education of its youth, and every opportunity to aid them must be taken. I believe that the importance of these summer projects and the brief time period remaining create a situation which requires immediate and decisive action.

I propose that the State of California sponsor a summer NYC project using state agencies to furnish training positions for youth in the following counties which do not have such projects:

ARTICLE II

OPERATION OF THE PROJECT

A. Administration

The Director of the Department of Employment shall have the authority to administer the State of California's summer NYC project, and in administering such project may perform the following activities:

1. Provide for the recruiting, selecting, referring, and counseling of applicants for the project.
2. Provide physical examinations when required.
3. Provide workmen's compensation for enrollees in the project.
4. Compile a follow-up report on all enrollees assessing and evaluating the effect of the program.
5. Provide placement services for all graduates of the program not returning to school.
6. Maintain all records required in administering the project.
7. Provide such other services as proper administration of the project may require.

B. Cooperation of Agencies and Departments

The agency administrators and department directors who administer any state activities in the above-mentioned 13 counties are requested to make known to the Department of Employment, headquarters office in Sacramento, training positions available for summer project enrollees. Upon the Department of Employment's referral of an enrollee the agency providing the training position shall have the final right to accept or reject each enrollee so referred and shall have the exclusive prerogative to terminate the training of any enrollee previously accepted. The agency providing the training position will be responsible for maintaining attendance records in accordance with the written directions of the Director of the Department of Employment. The training agency shall periodically prepare an evaluation of each enrollee receiving training in that agency, and the Department of Employment shall provide performance report forms for this purpose.

C. Grievance Procedure

Enrollees in the summer project may file grievances in accordance with the following procedure:

1. Grievances shall first be submitted to the enrollee's immediate supervisor in the participating state agency.
2. Grievances which are not settled to the enrollee's satisfaction may then be brought to the Facility Coordinator for the training agency, and thereafter to the Department of Employment Field Representative.
3. Final appeal under the project shall be to the Director of the Department of Employment or his delegate.

ARTICLE III

STATE COOPERATION IN NYC PROJECTS

All state agencies, departments, officers, and employees are requested to cooperate with present and future NYC projects including those sponsored by other public agencies and by private nonprofit organizations.

ARTICLE IV

NONDISCRIMINATION

In conformity with federal and state law and the Governor's Code of Fair Practices, all services and activities in connection with this Executive Order shall be conducted without discrimination on the basis of race, color, religion, national origin or sex.


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ARTICLE V
