The sum of the differences in land, climate, scenery and environment is the physical grandeur of our country.

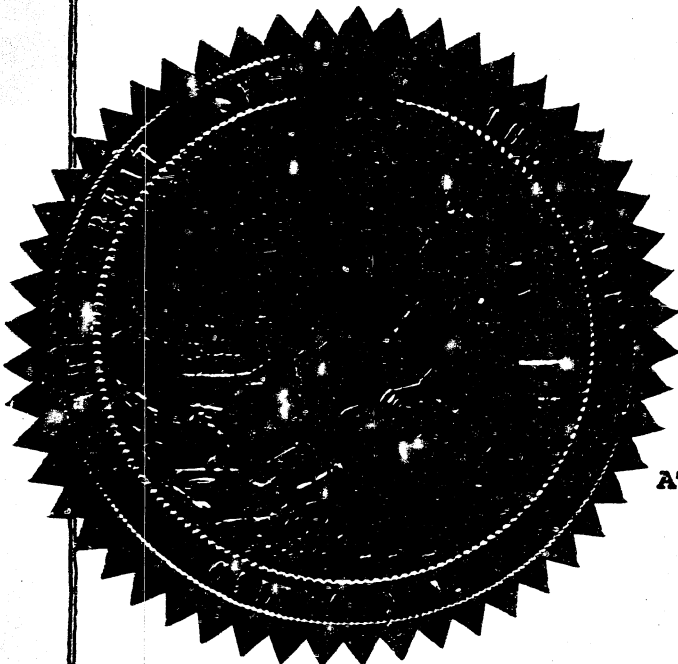
Out of the diversities of our people we have woven a society of scope and strength to match that grandeur.
