PROCLAMATION

The tragic and untimely death of John F. Kennedy, The President of the United States of America, is a matter of grave sorrow to the peoples of these United States and the State of California.

It is fitting that because of this sad occasion and the grief which is suffered by all, this day of November 22, 1963, be and is declared to be a day of mourning.

For these reasons, and to these ends, I, Edmund G. Brown, Governor of the State of California, declare a day of mourning commencing at noon, November 22, 1963, and ending at midnight, November 22, 1963, consistent with Section 6700(n) of the Government Code, and call upon all classes of citizens and businesses to join in the observance of this sad day.

State Departments and Agencies will maintain sufficient working force to meet emergency situations and provide vitally necessary public services.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of California to be affixed this twenty-second day of November, 1963.
