WHEREAS, on the 16th day of February, 1962, a State of Disaster was proclaimed to exist in the County of Los Angeles, as a result of abnormally heavy and continuous rainfall, causing extensive flood and rainstorm damage, creating imminent danger to the lives, health, and well-being of persons, the safety of public and private property, and the maintenance of essential services therein; and

WHEREAS, the conditions warranting and necessitating the proclamation of such State of Disaster are now deemed not to be beyond the control of the normal protective services, personnel, equipment and facilities of the public agencies and political subdivisions of that county;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, EDMUND G. BROWN, Governor of the State of California, by virtue of the powers and authority vested in me by the Constitution and laws of this State, do hereby proclaim the termination of said State of Disaster; and

I DIRECT that this proclamation shall take effect immediately and shall, as soon hereafter as possible, be filed in the Office of the Secretary of State of the State of California.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of California to be affixed.
