EXECUTIVE ORDER 66-7

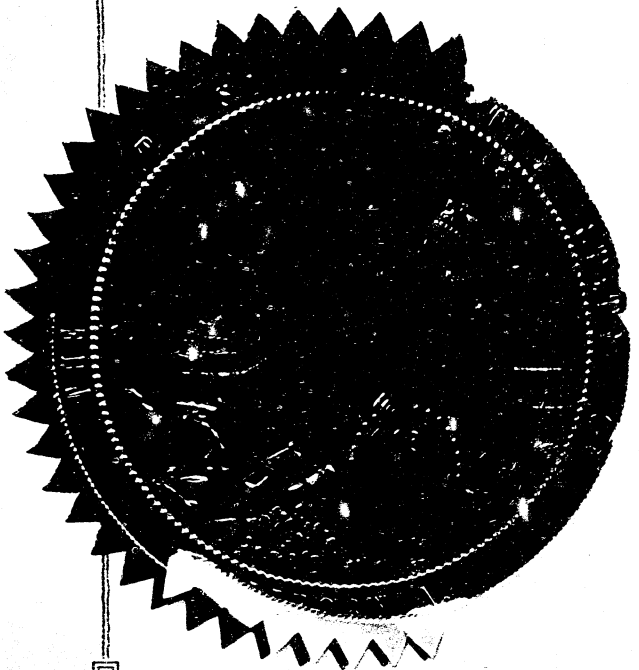
Authorization for Attorney General or representative to examine Board of Equalization records and disclose or use such records in criminal investigations or prosecutions. This order supercedes Executive Order 66-3, dated March 11, 1966.

By virtue of the authority vested in me as Governor of the State of California, and pursuant to the provisions of Section 15619 of the Government Code, it is ordered that Thomas C. Lynch, Attorney General of the State of California, his assistants and deputies, and any District Attorney or representative thereof of any County or City and County, be and they are hereby authorized to examine during the calendar year 1966, any and all records, reports, documents and papers in the possession or under the control of the State Board of Equalization or its employees relating to the appraisal of properties made in the performance of duties imposed on the Board by Section 1815 of the Revenue and Taxation Code, and they are hereby further authorized to disclose and use said records, reports, documents and papers and the information contained therein in any criminal investigation or prosecution, during the calendar year 1966.
