PROCLAMATION
OF A
STATE OF EMERGENCY

I, EDMUND G. BROWN, Governor of the State of California, having found that conditions of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property exist within the County of San Joaquin, State of California, beginning on or about September 26, 1980 as a result of severe flooding due to a levee failure on Lower Jones Tract, which, by reason of its magnitude, has destroyed several structures and threatens others and could expand to include other lower lying areas of the County, and having found that the mitigation of this disaster is beyond the control of the services, personnel, equipment and facilities of said County, and having been requested by the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors, I proclaim a State of Emergency in the County of San Joaquin.

I DIRECT that as soon hereafter as possible this proclamation be filed in the Office of the Secretary of State and that widespread publicity and notice be given to this proclamation.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of California to be affixed.
