EXECUTIVE ORDER B-100-82

WHEREAS, the Governor's Task Force on Alcohol, Drugs and Traffic Safety, created on December 30, 1980, submitted its report and recommendations on June 17, 1981; and

WHEREAS, the Task Force's major recommendations were thereafter enacted in Chapters 934, 935, 939, 940 and 941 of the Statutes of 1981, one of the most comprehensive packages of drunk driving legislation in the nation; and

WHEREAS, the Task Force recommended the designation of a single state agency with responsibility to coordinate the efforts of all state agencies having jurisdiction over the problem of driving under the influence and the appointment of an advisory group composed of local law enforcement officers, prosecutors and judicial officials to provide statewide liaison in implementing the new laws and the state's continuing efforts to combat the problem of drivers under the influence;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Edmund G. Brown Jr., Governor of the State of California, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and statutes of the State of California, do hereby issue this executive order to become effective immediately:

1. An advisory council is hereby created composed of the Directors of the Departments of Motor Vehicles, Alcohol and Drug Programs, the California Highway Patrol and the Office of Traffic Safety and representatives of the Department of Justice, local law enforcement, court administrators, prosecutors, the judiciary and the public. The Council shall monitor implementation of the new statutes relating to driving under the influence, serve as a clearinghouse to increase the cooperation among the various public agencies with jurisdiction in this area and recommend any administrative changes or additional legislation it believes necessary.

The advisory council shall meet at the call of its chair, designated by the Governor, at least four times per year. Staff support for the council shall be provided by the Office of Traffic Safety. Council members will serve without compensation but may be reimbursed for

their necessary travel expenses, subject to prior approval by the Office, from existing funds within the participating departments and agencies.

2. The California Highway Patrol shall, with the assistance of the advisory council, coordinate the various efforts of all state departments and agencies having jurisdiction over the problem of driving under the influence and shall serve as liaison with all local agencies and officials with responsibilities in this area.
3. All other state agencies responsible to the Governor are directed, and all other public entities are requested, to assist the California Highway Patrol and the advisory council in discharging their responsibilities.
