EXECUTIVE ORDER B82-81

WHEREAS, there are estimated to be approximately 60,000 Asian-Indians residing in the State of California; and

WHEREAS, Asian-Indians include persons of Indian Subcontinental origin, specifically those persons whose heritage derives from India, Pakistan, Sri Lanka and Bangladesh; and

WHEREAS, there is a need for consistent and equitable treatment of Asian-Indians;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Edmund G. Brown Jr., Governor of the State of California, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by the Constitution and statutes of the State of California do hereby issue this order, to become effective immediately:

1. There is established an Asian-Indian Advisory Council to the Governor to provide advice and counsel on the needs of and issues facing the Asian-Indian community in California.
2. Members of the Advisory Council shall be appointed by and serve at the pleasure of the Governor. The Chairperson shall be designated by and serve at the pleasure of the Governor. The Advisory Council shall choose other officers as it deems necessary. Members shall serve without compensation or reimbursement of expenses.
3. The Advisory Council shall provide the Governor with its first report by December 1, 1981.
