PROCLAMATION

I, EDMUND G. BROWN JR., Governor of the State of California,
proclaim as follows:

That conditions of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property prevailed at the time of a previous proclamation of May 11, 1979, as pertains to all that portion of Monterey County lying south of a line extending from the intersection of Camphora Road and Silliman Road due east to the Monterey-San Benito County line, and east of a line extending due south from that same intersection to the Pacific Ocean:

That it was proclaimed that a State of Emergency existed in the described area:

That I now find that a State of Emergency no longer exists in said area and that the local authorities are now able to cope with the situation:

Now, therefore, I proclaim that a State of Emergency no longer exists effective immediately in the above described area, and therefore the regulations for California's Gasoline Emergency filed with the Secretary of State on May 23, 1979, are no longer in effect in the described area.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of California to be affixed this 7th day of June, 1979.
