Senate Constitutional Amendment No. 5—A resolution to propose to the people of the State of California an amendment to the Constitution of the state, by adding to Article XXI thereof a new section to be numbered 3, relating to the division of the state.

1 *Resolved by the Senate, the Assembly concurring,* That the
2 Legislature of the State of California at its 1965 Regular Ses-

4 of the members elected to each of the two houses of the Legis-

8 Sec. 3. The Legislature, in compliance with Section 3 of

19 *of Ventura with the Pacific Ocean; thence northerly along*
20 *said last mentioned boundary to the point at which it inter-*
21 *sects with the boundary of the County of Kern; thence east-*
22 *erly along the southern boundary of the County of Kern to*
23 *the point at which such boundary intersects with the boundary*
24 *of the County of San Bernardino; thence northerly along the*

- 1 *eastern boundary of the County of Kern to the point at which*
- 2 *it intersects with the County of Inyo; and thence easterly along*
- 3 *the common boundary of the County of Inyo and County of*
- 4 *San Bernardino to the point at which it intersects with the*
- 5 *eastern boundary of the State of California.*
