REFERRED TO COMMITTEE ON GOVERNMENTAL EFFICIENCY

*Senate Joint Resolution No. 25—Relative to the
division of the state.*

1 *Resolved by the Senate and Assembly of the State of Cali-*
2 *fornia, jointly,* That the Legislature of the State of California
3 respectfully requests the Congress of the United States to
4 grant its consent, pursuant to Section 3 of Article IV of the
5 United States Constitution, to the formation of two new states
6 within the State of California effective on submission to, and
7 approval by, the Congress of a Constitution for each of the new
8 states, the dividing line between the two new states to be as
9 follows:

10 Beginning at the intersection of the boundary of the County
11 of Ventura with the Pacific Ocean; thence northerly along said
12 last mentioned boundary to the point at which it intersects with
13 the boundary of the County of Kern; thence easterly along the
14 southern boundary of the County of Kern to the point at which
15 such boundary intersects with the boundary of the County of
16 San Bernardino; thence northerly along the eastern boundary
17 of the County of Kern to the point at which it intersects with
18 the County of Inyo; and thence easterly along the common
19 boundary of the County of Inyo and the County of San
20 Bernardino to the point at which it intersects with the eastern
21 boundary of the State of California; and be it further

22 *Resolved,* That the Secretary of the Senate be hereby di-
23 rected to transmit copies of this resolution to the President
24 and Vice President of the United States, to the Speaker of the
25 House of Representatives, and to each Senator and Repre-
26 sentative from California in the Congress of the United States.
