

Highlights



Population Growth: Azusa’s population, now 46,000, increased by 4% over the past ten years, slower than the statewide growth of 10% but slightly faster than Los Angeles County. The biggest gains in population occurred among Hispanics and Asians, especially in the working-age population. The overall number of young people fell by 6%.

Diversity: Azusa remains predominantly Hispanic, with the share of population increasing from 64% to 68% over the past decade. The share of white, non-Hispanics declined from 24% to 19%.


Age Structure: The population is relatively young, with a median age of just 29, compared with 35 statewide. Relative to the state, Azusa has more young people, 33% compared with 28%, and fewer old people, 8% compared with 11%.

Households: Arcadia continues to have a larger than average share of family households, 76% compared with 69% statewide. Keeping pace with the statewide trend, the share of families without children increased from 30% to 36% of all households. The share of single-person households remained at 18%, well below the state rate of 23%.

Education: Although the share of adults who have not completed high school (27%) is greater than the statewide level of 20%, educational attainment has improved. This is particularly true for Hispanic adults; in 2000, 56% had not completed high school, but now the figure stands at 37%.

Income: Income in Azusa is slightly lower than in the state as a whole. Median household income is \$52,000, 87% of the state median. Azusa’s unemployment rate, 13% in June 2011, has been consistently above the statewide rate.

Foreign Born: The foreign-born population accounts for 34% of total population, compared with 27% statewide. Of the immigrants, 70% are from Mexico, a much higher share than the 44% statewide. Fourteen percent of all households are linguistically isolated, compared with 10% statewide.





In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010

11. Household Language, 2005-09




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity*

Unemployment Rate




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




