

Highlights



Population Growth: The population of Calabasas increased by 15% over the past ten years to 23,000, growing faster than the statewide rate of 10%. About half the gain occurred in the working-age population, with a substantial increase in the older population as well.

Diversity: The racial and ethnic makeup of Calabasas did not change significantly over the past decade. The population remains predominantly white, non-Hispanic with the share at 80% of total. The Asian share of total population increased from 8% to 9% and the Hispanic share from 5% to 6%.


Age Structure: The population of Calabasas is relatively old, with a median age of 42 (up from 39 in 2000), compared with 35 for the state. The age structure shifted upward over the past ten years and the share of the population age 65+ increased from 9% to 13% of total, higher than the statewide share of 11%.

Households: Family households, at 75% of total, are more common in Calabasas than statewide (69%). The share of traditional families—married couples with children—declined from 35% to 30%, compared with 23% statewide, while the share of families without children increased from 35% to 37%. Among those age 65+, only 16% live alone compared to 25% statewide.

Education: Educational attainment in Calabasas is well above statewide levels. Sixty-one percent of the adult population has attained a Bachelor’s degree or higher, compared with 30% statewide, and only 2% of adults have less than a high school education, one-tenth of the share in California.

Income: Median household income is \$117,000, almost twice the statewide median of \$60,000. Almost 40% of households reported incomes of \$150,000 or higher, compared with 12% statewide.

Foreign Born: The foreign-born population accounts for 24% of the total, compared with 27% statewide. Most of the immigrants are from Asia (58%) or Europe (25%). Only 10% of the immigrants are from Latin America.




Population by Age

In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010

11. Household Language, 2005-09







12. Household Income, 2005-09



13. Labor Force and Unemployment, 2006-11




14. Household Type, 2010

% of all households




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




