

Highlights




**Population Growth:** The population of the Fresno County Public Library jurisdiction increased by 16% over the last decade to 910,000, growing faster than the statewide rate of 10%. The greatest increase occurred among the Hispanic population, which grew by 115,000 (34%).

**Diversity:** Over the past ten years, the white, non-Hispanic share of population declined from 40% to 33%, while the Hispanic share of population increased from 43% to 50% of total.

**Age Structure:** The Fresno County Public Library jurisdiction has a higher share of young people than does the state, 33% compared with 28%. The 10% share of adults age 65+ is close to the rate in California as a whole.

**Foreign Born:** The foreign-born population accounts for 21% of the total population in the Fresno County Public Library jurisdiction, compared with 27% statewide. Among immigrants, 64% are from Mexico, compared with 44% statewide.

*Note: The Fresno County Public Library serves the county population not located within the Coalinga-Huron Unified School District Library. This profile slightly overstates the population because it includes unincorporated areas that are served by the Coalinga-Huron library.*





In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change








7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity\*

Unemployment Rate




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,\* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity\*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




