

Highlights




Population Growth: Population in Inglewood declined by 3% over the past ten years to 110,000, while Los Angeles County grew by 3% and California by 10%. The sharpest declines occurred among young people (-7,000) and black people (-5,000).

Diversity: The population in Inglewood became majority Hispanic between 2000 and 2010, with the share of population increasing from 46% to 51% of total. The black share of population, which equaled the Hispanic share in 2000, declined to 43%.

Age Structure: The age structure shifted upward slightly over the past decade, although Inglewood is still somewhat younger than California overall. The median age increased from 30 to 33 due to a decrease in the number of young people and an increase in the number of older people. Young people make up 30% of the total population, down from 35% in 2000, whereas people 65+ now account for 9% of the total, up from 7% in 2000.

Households: While the share of family households is the same in Inglewood as statewide (69%), traditional family households—married couples with children—are less common in Inglewood at 19% of total, than statewide (23%). In contrast, single-person households are more common here than statewide, at 26% compared with 23%. Single-person households are also more common among people age 65+: 31% live alone, compared with the statewide rate of 25%.

Education: Educational attainment is lower in this jurisdiction than in California overall. Just 17% of adults have earned Bachelor’s degrees, compared with 30% of adults statewide, and 29% have not completed high school, compared with 20% statewide.





In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010



10. Foreign Born, 2005-09




11. Household Language, 2005-09




12. Household Income, 2005-09

b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity*





13. Labor Force and Unemployment, 2006-11






14. Household Type, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*





16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09
