


Highlights



Population by Age

**Population Growth:** The City of Los Angeles, the largest city in the state, added 98,000 people over the last ten years bringing total population to nearly 3.8 million. This ten-year population growth rate of under 3% is far below the statewide growth rate of 10%. The Hispanic population grew by nearly 120,000 and the Asian population added 55,000. In contrast, the black population declined by 55,000. Most of the population gain occurred in the working-age population, which grew by 155,000. The number of young people declined by 97,000.

**Diversity:** The population mix shifted only slightly over the past ten years, with the Hispanic share of total population increasing from 47% to 48% and the Asian share increasing from 10% to 11%. The black share of total population declined from 11% to 9%.

**Age Structure:** Los Angeles remains younger than the state overall with a median age of 34 compared with 35 statewide. A substantial increase in the working-age population, combined with a decline in the number of children, caused the median age to increase from 32 to 34 over the past ten years. Although the number of people age 65+ increased, their share of total remained at 10%. Mirroring the statewide trends, the Hispanic population is younger than the white, non-Hispanic population.

**Income:** Households in the City of Los Angeles generally have lower incomes than do households statewide. Median household income is \$49,000, just 80% of the statewide median of \$60,000, and 27% of households have income less than \$25,000 compared with 20% statewide. The unemployment rate currently at nearly 14% remains persistently above the state level. More than 19% of all individuals are living below the federal poverty level compared with 13% statewide.


**Foreign Born:** Forty percent of the population is foreign born, well above the statewide share of 27%. The City of Los Angeles has a higher share of immigrants from Latin America, particularly from outside Mexico, than is true statewide. Nineteen percent of all households are linguistically isolated (no one in the household age 14 and over speaks English at least “very well.”)

In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change








7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010

11. Household Language, 2005-09



a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity\*




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,\* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity\*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




