

Highlights




**Population Growth:** The population of Tehama County increased by 13% over the past decade to 63,000; this growth rate was slightly higher than the statewide rate of 10%. The greatest increases occurred among the working-age and Hispanic populations, both of which grew by approximately 5,000.

**Diversity:** Tehama County remains majority white, non-Hispanic at 72% of the total, although this population share has declined from 78% in the last decade. The Hispanic population share increased from 16% to 22% over the same period.

**Age Structure:** A relatively large share of Tehama County’s population is age 65+; as of 2010, 16% of the population fit into this older age bracket, compared with 11% statewide. This is reflected in the county’s median age, which at 40 is significantly higher than the statewide median of 35.

**Education:** Educational attainment is lower in Tehama County than in California as a whole. Only 13% of adults have at least a Bachelor’s degree, compared with 30% statewide. High school completion levels (80%) are the same as statewide levels.

**Income:** Median household income in the county is \$37,000, just 61% of the statewide median of \$60,000. In addition, recent unemployment rates are high—16% as of June 2011—compared with the statewide unemployment rate of 12%.





In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010



9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010




10. Foreign Born, 2005-09




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity\*

Unemployment Rate






14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,\* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity\*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




