REFERRED TO COMMITTEE ON CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS.

*Assembly Constitutional Amendment No. 44—Relative to the boundary of the State of California.*

1     Resolved by the assembly, the senate concurring, That the  
2 legislature of the State of California at its forty-fourth session,  
3 commencing on the third day of January, one thousand nine  
4 hundred twenty-one, two-thirds of the members elected to  
5 both the senate and assembly, respectively, voting in favor  
6 thereof, hereby proposes to the people of the State of Cali-  
7 fornia that section one of article twenty-one of the constitu-  
8 tion of this state be amended to read as follows:  
9     SECTION 1. The boundary of the State of California shall  
10 be as follows: Commencing at the point of intersection of  
11 the forty-second degree of north latitude with the one hundred  
12 twentieth degree of longitude west from Greenwich, and  
13 running south on the line of said one hundred twentieth degree  
14 of west longitude until it intersects the thirty-ninth degree  
15 of north latitude; thence running in a straight line in a  
16 southeasterly direction to the sixth standard parallel south  
17 and the southeast corner of Inyo county; thence westerly  
18 along the southerly boundary line of Inyo county, to the  
19 northeast corner of Kern county; thence along the easterly  
20 boundary line of Kern county to the southeast corner thereof;  
21 thence westerly along the southerly boundary lines of Kern  
22 and San Luis Obispo counties to the Pacific ocean, and extend-  
23 ing therein three English miles; thence running in a north-  
24 westerly direction and following the direction of the Pacific  
25 ocean to the forty-second degree of north latitude; thence on  
26 the line of said forty-second degree of north latitude to the  
27 place of beginning. Also, including all the islands, harbors,  
28 and bays along and adjacent to the coast.
