REFERRED TO COMMITTEE ON GOVERNMENTAL EFFICIENCY

An act granting consent of the Legislature to the formation of two states within the jurisdiction of California.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. In compliance with Section 3 of Article IV of
2 the United States Constitution, the Legislature hereby grants
3 its consent to the formation within the existing boundaries of
4 the State of California of two new states, the first to consist
5 of all that territory in the State of California north of the
6 line described in Section 2 and the second to consist of all that
7 territory in the State of California south of the line described
8 in Section 2.
- 9 SEC. 2. The dividing line between the two new states re-
10 ferred to in Section 1 is particularly described as follows:
11 Beginning at the intersection of the boundary of the County
12 of Ventura with the Pacific Ocean; thence northerly along said
13 last mentioned boundary to the point at which it intersects
14 with the boundary of the County of Kern; thence easterly
15 along the southern boundary of the County of Kern to the
16 point at which such boundary intersects with the boundary of
17 the County of San Bernardino; thence northerly along the
18 eastern boundary of the County of Kern to the point at which
19 it intersects with the County of Inyo; and thence easterly
20 along the common boundary of the County of Inyo and County

New act.

Expresses consent of Legislature to division of state, and describes boundaries of two new states.

To become operative upon adoption of constitutional amendment authorizing Legislature to consent to division of state.

Vote—Majority; Appropriation—No; State Expense—No.

4 the people of a constitutional amendment authorizing the Leg-
