


# TUNING YOUR UKULELE



There are four strings, and they are tuned to the notes **G – C – E – A** from the fourth string (top – closest to your head) to the first string (bottom – closest to your lap).

1. First make sure the tuner is on—the power button is on the bottom left, with the symbol: 
2. Clip the tuner to the head of the ukulele and adjust it so you can read the display.
3. Many tuners will have a number in the corner of the display, such as “440” – this relates to the pitch; no need to change it.
4. Pluck the top string (**G**), and tighten or loosen the string by turning the appropriate tuning peg until the needle on the display is pointing straight up, and the display turns **green** – this means it is perfectly in tune for that note.
5. Do this for the other strings, until they are tuned to the notes **G – C – E – A, from top string down to bottom**. Tuners will usually mark the bottom string as 1, and the top string as 4. Make sure you are turning the peg for the string you are tuning!
6. Remember to turn off the tuner while you play, to save the battery. Push and hold the button until it turns off.
